Health & Safety

Smoke Machines, Hazers, Pyrotechnics, Naked Flame, COSHH, Weapons & Lasers

Please provide details of any pyrotechnics, smoke effects (including hazers) or the use of naked flames at least 14 days in advance of your event. Similarly, details of all substances falling under the COSHH regulations must be provided 14 days in advance of your event.

Details of laser location, laser power, control measurements and risk assessment must be provided 14 days in advance of your event.

We reserve the right to disallow the use of any smoke machines, pyrotechnics, lasers or effects if we deem them to be unsafe, or insufficient notice has been given. The fire panel must be disabled before the use of smoke machines or pyrotechnics - please confirm with the Technician/Duty Manager on the day of your event before using them to avoid evacuation and potential delays to your event. They must be operated by a competent person

Flying & Rigging

All riggers must be competent and experienced in use of manual hemp lines and must carry their own Public Liability Insurance. All work must be carried out to current guidelines and legislation. All points must have independent, fire resistant, suitably rated safeties - the use of zip ties as a substitute is not allowed. The venue can provide safeties at a cost per point. The Technician/Duty Manager may disallow rigging at their discretion.

Electrical Equipment

All electrical equipment brought to the venue must be in good condition, as inspected by a competent individual. RCD protection must be present on all distribution outlets. Equipment and staff must comply with the Electricity at Work Regulations 1989, particularly regarding the testing of Portable Appliances. The Technician/Duty Manager may test equipment or disallow the use of equipment that is deemed unsafe.

Drapes, Backdrops & Scenery

This venue does not have a safety curtain - please ensure any scenery, drapes and backdrops are fire resistant to the appropriate level. We reserve the right to perform controlled flame tests and to prohibit the use of materials that we deem unsafe.

Control of Noise at Work Regulations 2005

As per the guidelines laid out in the Home Office guide to Safety and Welfare at Pop Concerts, we reserve the right to monitor sound levels and to reduce the sound level if we deem it necessary; this includes during non-show times.



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
